THE 2011 LDMGA GOLF SEASON

The handicap records kept by the Golf Association of Michigan (GAM) show that 4357 rounds at Lake Doster were entered by our members during the "active season" from April 1 until November 1. There were also 758 scores entered for "away" courses for a grand total of 5115 rounds for the season The average USDA index for these rounds was 15.1 (which equals a 16 handicap for our white tees).

For the season, 32.8% of our members had an improved handicap over the season. 4.1% had no change, but 63.1% saw their handicaps rise. Rounds posted by members varied from 1 to 100 with 37 members posting 50 or more rounds.

RULES CHANGE FOR 2012

The definition of "addressing the ball" has been changed to say that a player has addressed the ball when he has grounded his club immediately in front of or behind the ball. Taking a stance is now irrelevant. Therefore, since you do not ground your club in a bunker or water hazard, you never address a ball in a hazard. The penalty under Rule 18-2b remains the same for a ball which moves after you address it — one stroke and you must replace the ball. However, a new exception has been added to Rule 18-2b. This exception says that if it is known or virtually certain that the player did not cause his ball to move, the penalty does not apply. So — if you have addressed your ball, and then a gust of vind moves the ball, there is no penalty and the ball is played from its newlocation. But, remember — it must be known or virtually certain that the player did not

<u>Rules of Golf</u> Gimmees? Match play, yes; Stroke play? NEVER!

The rules are clear - you can conceed any putt, hole or match when playing match play. {The only person(s) involved is your opponent(s).} However, instroke play you cannot give any putt as the whole field in the event must be protected.

Rule 3-2. "Failure to Hole Out

If a competitor fails to hole out at any hole and does not correct his mistake before he makes a stroke on the next teeing ground or, in the case of the last hole of the round, before he leaves the putting green, he is disqualified."

However, if the ball was moved by a fellow competitor without permission, he may replace the ball and continue play without penalty - Rule 18-4.

2011 CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP

The first round pairings will be posted and also sent to members with email addresses. It is up to you to set up the match with your opponent. A list of phone numbers for all members is in the tray by the handicap computer. The Pro Shop number to get your tee time is 685-5308.

Your first match should be completed by June 29 Subsequent matches (for winners) should be played within 3 weeks. Any problems in arranging matches should be brought to the attention of the Handicap Committee. If disputes cannot be resolved, the match will be forfeited.

Be sure to report the result of your matches to the Pro Shop upon completion of your match.

MATCH PLAY RULES

The rules for match play differ from those for stroke play. Review Rule 2 in "The Rules of Golf". Because of this, it is not desirable to play a match at the same time you are competing in a stroke play event.

One major difference is described in Rule 2-4:

A player may concede a match at any time prior to the start or conclusion of that match.

A player may concede a hole at any time prior to the start or conclusion of that hole.

A player may concede his opponent's next stroke at any time,......

A concession may not be declined or withdrawn.

Other differences for match play are scattered throughout the "Rules of Golf". See Rule 6-2, Rule 7-1, 7-2, Rule 10-1 (Describes the order of play in matches). Rule 15-3, etc.

The Club Championship is our only event played as individual matches. It is different, but most find it memorable!

STROKE ADJUSTMENT RULES

Before you enter your score in the GAM system for handicap purposes, you must adjust your hole by hole scores according to the following:

If your handicap for the course played is 9 or lower, the maximum score allowed for any hole is a double bogey.

If your handicap for the course played is 10 to 19, the maximum score allowed for any hole is seven (7).

If your handicao for the course played is 20 to 29, the maximum score allowed on any hole is an eight (8).

If your handicap for the course played is 30 or over, the maximum score allowed on any hole is nine (9).

If you enter your scores in the GAM system hole by hole, it will alert you to any scores that are too high.

Rule 26 WATER HAZARDS, INCLUDING LATER AL WATER HAZARDS.

The course is marked with red stakes for lateral "water" hazards and with yellow stakes for "regular" water hazards. When your ball is in a water hazard, or if it is virtually certain that your ball is in the hazard, you may under penalty of one stroke:

a. Play a ball as nearly possible at the last spot from which the original ball was played (see Rule 20-5); or

b. Drop a ball behind the hazard keeping the point where the ball LAST crossed the margin of the hazard directly between the hole and the spot where the ball is dropped, with no limit on how far behind the hazard the ball is dropped; or

c.. An additional option available only if the ball is in a lateral hazard; drop the ball within 2 club lenths of and not nearer the hole than the point where it LAST crossed the margin of the hazard.

The lateral hazards along many of the holes avoid the more severe penalty associated with a ball out of bounds where both stroke and distance are lost. However, if you decide to play the ball within the hazard, you must NOT:

a. Test the condition of the hazard;

b. Touch the ground in the hazard with your hand or club; or,

c. Touch or move a loose impediment lying in or touching the hazard. See Rule 13-4.

The hazard on the right front of hole #6 is a regular water hazard and should be played as such.

THE LAKE DOSTER MEN'S GOLF ASSOCIATION

The primary objectives of the Lake Doster Men's Golf Association are to promote and encourage competitive golf programs, to provide golfing contacts among the members and to provide golf handicaps to implement such programs. We invite you to join if at all interested. The LDMGA sponsors golf events throughout the summer. These events include the weekly Tuesday league, 7 Saturday events, 7 two day tournaments and 8 mixed events. The next page gives the schedule for these events. We believe you would enjoy the opportunity to meet and play with the members of LDMGA. All men who have season memberships to the Lake Doster Golf Club are welcome to join LDMGA. We would be pleased to have you join the association.

TUE SDAY LEAGUE

This is a nine hole weekly league played from early May until late August for 16 weeks of competition. The format has been individual net Stableford points using 100% of the player's handicap with a maximum of 23 points allowed. The league nine may be played anytime on Tuesday, but tee times are blocked out from 4 to 6 for the majority of league play. Special (optional) two man events are run each week along with the league with a separate entry fee and pay out.

INFORMATION MANUAL

The LDMGA publishes an "Information Manual" which gives the objectives of the asociation and describes the tournaments and rules, along with phone numbers for all members.

DUES STRUCTURE

The basic dues for LDMGA are \$50 to be paid by the first day of Joey The Jet Derby, our first major tournament. You must be a paid member of LDMGA to participate in the tournaments (and, to win any prizes). The dues include membership in the Golf Association of Michigan which handles our handicap system.

Also included is "hole-in-one" insurance which credits \$150 toward your celebration if you score a hole in one at Lake Doster.

The LDMGA issues a newsletter 8 to 10 times a season which is sent out on the internet with a few printed copies for those without email.

Budget permitting, we also purchase items to make the course or club house area more attractive or playable. The Tuesday league membership is an additonal \$20 for the 16 week season. Each toumament has an entry fee, varying from \$10 for most Saturday events to \$400 or so for the Member-Guest event.

A membership application is on the second page of this newsletter.

SENIOR LEAGUE

Golfers, 55 and over, whether they are members of LDMGA or not, play each Wednesday morring in an informal weekly event, followed by donuts and coffee (included in the \$5 entry fee). Teams are made up by lottery after everyone arrives prior to the tee time. јапцату, 2011

BLOODY MARY SCRAMBLE

This is the first event of the season. It is held on a Saturday in early April (April 2 this year) so the weather is unpredictable. Three man scramble teams are selected by the tournament committee to mix golfers of various handicaps and newand cld members. The entry fee is usually \$5 with prizes paid to the top few finishers. This event is open to all men who wish to play. You do not have to be a member of the LDMGA.

The annual spring general membership meeting of LDMGA is held on this same day, preceding golf, while the weather warms!

JOEY THE JET DERBY

This is the first two day tournament. Two man teams play net best ball for the two 18 hole rounds using 90% of handicap. The prize for 1st place has been single memberships to the Lake Doster Golf Club for the following year. Other leading teams are awarded substantial gift certificates. This is a popular and fun event.

CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP

This is a match play tournament flighted and played by handicap except for the championship flight which plays scratch from the blue tee markers. Trophies are awarded to all flight champions at the fall banquet.

PRESIDENT'S CUP

This is an annual 36 hole individual event with a gross division and a net division. The winners have their names engraved on a standing trophy as well as a personal trophy. The presentations are made at the fall banquet.

SATURDAY EVENTS

On two Saturdays each month, excluding major events, we play an organized 18 hole tournament. Sign up is required, usually by the preceeding Thursday evening. The teams are usually 4 man and selected by draw. The entry fee is usually \$10 with 3 to 5 places paid depending on the number of entrants.

MEMBER-GUEST TOURNAMENT

This two (or three, optionally) day event is planned to give all participants a pleasant time both golfing and socializing. The entry fee includes drinks and lunches for the players as well as food for four on Saturday evening. There are many special door prizes and, usually, a chance to win other prizes.

MIXED EVENTS

In cooperation with the Lake Doster Ladies' Golf Association, we co-sponsor eight mixed events during the summer. Most are held on Sundays. The format varies with some using husband-wife teams and others using couples selected by draw. You may sign up as a single with the possibility of being matched with an available lady if you don't have a golfing spouse.

MEMBER-MEMBER(S)

This 36 hole event creates more interest than any other. The format has been 1 day of best ball and 1 day of total net with the total of the 2 days winning the big prize.

A Senior Member-Member is held in September played under a different format, usually 2 best balls of a threesome, a one day event
